Introduction

Not long after meeting Sheffield Forgemasters CEO, Dr. Graham Honeyman, I became keenly aware of his passion and respect for the people who work for him. I believe this to be a key factor in the Company's success story. And what a story it is!

So when he asked me to create a piece of boardroom artwork that would tell a tale about Sheffield Forgemasters, I knew it should be about the people who work there. And the more I got to know about the Company and its staff, the more enthusiastic I became.

Many of the skills required to work at Forgemasters are so specialised they can only be learned on the job. For this reason Dr. Honeyman takes a particular interest in the Company's apprenticeship scheme.

Feeling rather like an apprentice myself, I had a lot to learn about the steel industry in general and Sheffield Forgemasters in particular. I expected darkness and industrial dirt and gloom and wondered how I could create the artwork in my colourful style. There were countless meetings, site visits and photographs of people and places at the Brightside Lane operations. Always I sensed when talking to staff that Dr. Honeyman's passion and pride had infected them too. They all seemed to work hard, loved being part of a special company and were happy to share all sorts of colourful ideas for me to paint (often without realising it).

But it's not just team spirit that is huge at Forgemasters. The buildings are intimidatingly massive, filled with scary machinery and great balls of fire! There are workers dressed in heat-resistant suits who remind me of the Tin Man from *The Wizard of Oz*. I saw steel scrap become liquid fire and I learned about the processes that transformed it into enormous finished components destined for places all over the world. Hurrah Sheffield!

Thus Freddy Furnace was created, a young apprentice on his first day of work at Sheffield Forgemasters. (He's the one wearing a learner sign!) There are six chronological scenes, beginning with Freddy's early rise from bed and ending with a staff picnic at the Forgemasters nature reserve. With a light-hearted approach, I surrounded the apprentice with a supporting cast of characters who bear an uncanny resemblance to actual directors and other staff. To protect the innocent, all characters have been given pseudonyms. For example, Don Julio Jominy in his sombrero looks a bit like Jesus the R&D Director, and Ingrid Ingot reminds some people of Nurse Paula.

I owe a tremendous debt of gratitude to Dr. Honeyman for the privilege of spending most of 2012 working on this commission, and to Siobhan Newton, my dear friend and patron, for the introduction and encouragement. This has by far been my most enjoyable project to date.

Painting No. 1 Rise and Shine

Freddy Furnace's submarine alarm clock has gone off at 5:00 AM. He doesn't want to be late so he has slept in his hard hat and safety goggles, perhaps handed down from his grandfather who is pictured on the wall. Freddy's heavy metal guitar features the Forgemasters 'flower' logo and we can see the reading material that influences this keen young man.





Painting No. 2 Freddy Arrives

Inside the four 'petals' of the Forgemasters logo, clockwise from top left:


- (1) A thumbs-up from Ingrid Ingot means Freddy is fit for duties.
- (2) Freddy meets the big boss, George La Forge, outside Reception beside a quirky sculpture of Pan.
- (3) Kazzy Cast welcomes Freddy with a hot cuppa and invites him to the after-work party.
- (4) Freddy undergoes health and safety training and gets some light reading for homework.





Painting No. 3 Scorpio Rising

Three wise monkeys - Rusty Scrap, Stevie Steel and Freddy himself - are in the melt shop where a new scorpion sculpture is being made. Martin Site and Don Julio Jominy are doing their technical analysis while Health and Safety Director, Mister Happy, is on standby.





Painting No. 4 Lunch al Forno

Directors of Vulcan (Harris Ferrous, Mister Spockford and Vinnie Volcano) have been lured from the foundry by smells of very hot pizzas coming from the forge. Sparker the Forge MD is on his coffee break, while Freddy's baking skills are being assessed by Quality Assurance Director Wentzell Tensile.






Painting No. 5 The Da Vinci Crew


The Picnic (continued)
